

# INTRODUCTORY.

THE edition of the New Bedford Directory now completed, is the seventh that has been published since the commencement of the work, and the second since the City organization.

It were in vain to hope, amidst the unceasing change of so large a portion of our community, that perfect accuracy could be obtained at any time, but when to these are added the removals and changes caused by one of the most remarkable emigrations upon record, the Directory becomes necessarily, yet more imperfect.

The information collected in the first instance by personal inquiry at every house in the City, was collated with all the lists and other means of information known to the compilers. It was then submitted to the examination of as many of the citizens as practicable.

In presenting it to the public, the compilers would embrace the opportunity to return their sincere thanks to those who, during its progress, have so kindly aided their inquiries, and encouraged their efforts.

The Statistical Information with reference to the Whaling business usually published in this Directory, being a transcript of the tables published in the Whalemen's Shipping List, by Henry Lindsey, Esq., and consequently accessible to all in the pages of that Journal, has been omitted in this edition.

The information with reference to the Societies and Incorporated Institutions, was obtained from their respective officers.

The directory of the Streets, has been corrected from the official record.

The Advertising Directory is collected from good substantial money-paying advertisers, and to it the attention of the public is respectfully invited.

# NEW BEDFORD.

THE Township of Dartmouth in its original extent, as purchased of the good old Indian Chieftain Massasoit, in 1652, and as it remained till divided in 1787, embraced an extent of twenty miles of sea coast without including the shores of its harbors, of which Acushnet, Apponegansett and Acoaxet were the principal.

The Township of New Bedford was incorporated at this division in 1787.

New Bedford received a City Charter March 18, 1847.

The population of New Bedford in 1790, was 700, in 1820, 3,947, in 1830, 7,592, in 1840, 12,584, in 1847, 16,031, and in 1852, it was 18,048.

We subjoin an interesting document compiled by our venerable predecessor, Abraham Sherman, Jr., dated 11 mo. 30, 1821, as worthy of preservation on its own account, and the best possible preface to this volume.

# New Bedford, 11 mo. 30, 1821.

To gratify that species of curiosity, which seems naturally to lead the human mind to trace the origin and early incidents of smaller communities as well as of nations, I avail myself of the recollections of an aged and intelligent citizen,\* now in his 79th year, to record some particulars of the first settlement of New Bedford, in connection with some account of the Whale Fishery, to which it owed its origin, and has been principally indebted for its prosperity.

In the year 1751, when our informant was nine years of age, there were two or three vessels from Aponeganset River, in the Whale Fishery, the owners of which (Jno. Wady and Daniel Wood) he well recollects; and he thinks there were then one or two from the west side of Acushnet River, (owned by Joseph and Caleb Russell,) and perhaps one or two from the eastern shore. Whales were then princi-

pally taken on what was called the Southern ground, between Georgs' Bank and the Capes of Virginia, and voyages were of four to six weeks continuance—but the Fishery was about this time extended to the Grand Bank of New-Foundland, or rather to the eastward of it, and the voyages lengthened to three months.

Previous to the year 1760, more vessels were fitted from Apone-ganset, than from Acushnet River; but the latter, having the advantage of a better and more convenient harbour, now began to attract the attention of men of business. Our informant was early engaged in a seafaring life, from Aponeganset, and mostly in the Fishery. The vessel to which he was attached fitted in the year above mentioned, from what was afterwards called Bedford, on Acushnet River, and he thinks was the first vessel, not owned by persons in its immediate vicinity, that came there to fit out. The present scite of the town was then a forest, through which a rough cartway led to the shore, and a try-house was the only building, other than the farm houses on the County road.

In the winter of 1760, John Loudon purchased of Joseph Russell, an acre of land, (the first lot that was sold from his homestead farm,) a few rods south of what is now called the Four Corners; on which he erected a house in the summer of '61. His object was to carry on ship building. His own trade was that of a caulker. In the spring of the same year, Benjamin Taber purchased a lot of land further north, and built a shop for the purpose of carrying on the boat building and block making business, at which he had served an apprenticeship at Nantucket. The same year, 1761, John Allen, a house carpenter, purchased a lot of land on the south side of Prospect street, on which he built a house, afterwards sold to Barzillai Myrick, a ship carpenter. In 1762, Gideon Mosher, who was also a mechanic, purchased a lot of land, and built a house on the north side of Prospect street; which he afterwards (1765) sold to Benjamin Taber.

In December of the same year, 1762, Elnathan Sampson, of Wareham, purchased a lot of land, bounded south on land previously sold

Russell.

‡ John Allen's lot was four rods wide, and extended from the Four Corners to the water, the same on which Pinkham's Inn and other buildings now stand. Gideon Mosher's lot was of the same width, on the north side of the street. It was sold by him to Benjamin Taber, who at the same time purchased four rods adjoining to it on the north, and extending, with the other to the water.

<sup>†</sup>There were then standing on the County Road, the houses of Joseph Russell, Caleb Russell, Ephraim Kempton, and Samuel Willis, which are still remaining; also a house that belonged to Joseph Russell, father of Joseph and Caleb, which stood a little to the south of the house now occupied by William R. Rotch, near a well which is still in use. The scite of a house that belonged to Joseph Russell, father of the last mentioned may still be traced on the east side of the road, near the former mansion of Caleb Russell.

to John Loudon, and "north and east, on land left for ways or streets." These ways or streets, were what are now called the Main or Union, and Water streets. The lot, (the same that is now owned by the widows Patty Hussey and Ruth Ross,) was eight rods in length from east to west, and four rods wide, and was purchased for £6.13.4-Less than one third of its front on Union street, was leased the last year, on an annual ground rent of 90 dollars. [E. Sampson was a blacksmith.]

Thus was the infant settlement began by industrious and enterprising mechanics; and it appears from the phraseology of the deed above referred to, that it was then expected it would in time assume the character of a town. Capital, however, was still wanting to give activity to business; but this was soon after supplied, to a very considerable extent, by the acquisition of an enterprising merchant, Joseph Rotch, of Nantucket, who in 1765, after examining several different situations, fixed on this as an eligible port for the prosecution of the Whale Fishery. He made a purchase of ten acres of land, in one body, besides a number of smaller lots in different parts of the town, and removing hither himself, transferred his business from Nantucket to the Acushnet. To him the village was indebted for its name. The property of the soil being in the Russell family, and that being the family name of the Duke of Bedford, he gave it the name which it has since continued to bear.

The Whale Fishery appears to have been carried on from Cape Cod prior to its prosecution from any other part of America. "In the "year 1680, a Mr. Paddock, from Cape Cod, came to Nantucket to in- "struct the English how to whale in boats from the shore, which busi- ness continued good till 1760, when it became poor by the scarcity of whales. In the spring of 1726, there were eighty-six whales caught here. One Mr. Loper previous to this was engaged in the business, but not to any amount worthy of record."—Nantucket Inq.

The "Mr. Loper" above referred to, was also from Cape Cod,—and a copy was recently published of his agreement with the inhabitants of the Island, to prosecute the business from their shores. This was in the year 1672.

"In the year 1770 there were employed in the Whale Fishery from Nantucket, 123 sail of vessels, sloops, schooners and brigs, making about 10,000 tons, and navigated by about 1,600 men. From Sept. 11 to October 28, they all arrived in port, having been absent from four to six month, and landed 14,058 bbls. oil. There are now living, (March 28, 1822,) ten of the Captains that were in said fleet."—Nantucket Inquirer.

#### SUPREME JUDICIAL COURT.

The Supreme Court has exclusive cognizance of all capital crimes, and exclusive chancery jurisdiction so far as chancery powers are

given by statute; and concurrent original jurisdiction of all civil cases when the amount in dispute exceeds \$600, in Suffolk, and \$300 in the other Counties.

Law terms are held at Plymouth and Taunton, alternately on the 4th Tuesday next after the 4th Tuesday in September, for the Coun-

ties of Bristol, Plymouth, Barnstable and Dukes.

Nisi Prius terms for Bristol County are held at Taunton on the 7th Tuesday next after the 1st Tuesday in March, and in New Bedford on the 2d Tuesday in November.

#### COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.

The Court of Common Pleas is held for the trial of civil cases above \$20, and, except in Suffolk County, has criminal jurisdiction in all cases not capital.

It is held for Bristol County, at Taunton, on the 2d Mondays of March and September, and at New Bedford on the 2d Mondays of

June and December.

### NEW BEDFORD RURAL CEMETERY.

This Cemetery is on the west side of Dartmouth street, and is about one mile in a south westerly direction from the City Hall. It was incorporated April 12, 1837, but is now owned by the city.

#### OAK GROVE CEMETERY.

This Cemetery, covering eight acres of ground, is situated on the north side of Smith street, and is about one mile north west from the City Hall. A part of the Cemetery is laid out in city lots, the exclusive occupancy of which may be obtained from the city authorities, and the remainder is devoted to indiscriminate burial.

# Schools and School Teachers.

#### PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

The Public Schools in New Bedford, exclusive of the adult schools, are thirty-two in number, and are divided into five classes, viz:

- I. THE HIGH SCHOOL, in which are taught all over twelve years of age who are found qualified to pursue the studies taught therein, in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth.
- II. Grammar Schools, in which are taught those between the ages of ten and twenty-one.\*
- III. INTERMEDIAL SCHOOLS, in which are taught children between the ages of seven and ten.
- IV. PRIMARY SCHOOLS, in which are taught children between the ages of four and seven.
- V. Schools in the remote parts of the city, partaking to some extent of the character of all these classes.

These are in constant operation throughout the year, excepting one or two weeks vacation at the end of each term. In the 2d class the boys and girls are taught in separate schools, but in each of the others they attend the same schools.

The number of teachers now in the employment of the city is sixty-nine. Of these ten are males, and fifty-nine are females. The

The Streets of New Bedford, with a very few exceptions, are laid out North and South, East and West intersecting each other at right angles, or nearly so. Those running North and South are numbered commencing at Union Street and increasing each way, with the even numbers on the East and the odd numbers on the West side. Those running East and West, are numbered, commencing at the river and increasing Westerly, with the even numbers on the South, and the odd numbers on the North side. Any departure from this rule will be noted in the following list.

The letters enclosed by brackets, which follow the name of any street, signify the general bearing of such street from the City Hall: Thus, School street. [S.] is South from the City Hall.

Acushnet, a village at the head of the Acushnet River, about three and a half miles, in a northerly direction from the City Hall—the westerly part being in New Bedford, and the easterly part in Fairhaven.

Acushnet Avenue, [N.] from the Rail Road crossing at B. Rodman's

farm, North to Acushnet Village.

Acushnet Heights, an elevated portion of land extending northerly from Willis street, on each side of County street, commanding a fine and extensive view of the harbor, Buzzard's Bay, Fairhaven Village, and the opposite shores of the Acushnet River.

Allen's Mill Road, [N.W.] leading from Perry's Corner to "Allen's

Mills," in Dartmouth

Allen Street, [S. W.] from County street West, and nearly in line with Wing and Howland streets. Numbers commence at County

Cannonville, the neighborhood in the vicinity of the Meeting House standing at the junction of the "Noel Taber" road with the "Smith's Mills" road.

Cedar street, [N. W.] fifth street west of County and extends from Morgan street north to Smith street—open from Kempton to Smith.

Centre street. [E.] from North Water east to Central Wharf. Chancery street, [N. W.] from Kempton street north. This street is

the seventh west of County.

Charles street, [N.] from Purchase street west to County, and in line with High street. The numbers on this street are in continuation of the numbers on High street.

Cheapside, [E.] from Union to William street, in range with Fifth,

and nearly in line with Pleasant street.

Cherry street, [S. W.] from Sixth street west to County, and nearly

in line with Coffin street—open from Seventh to County.

Chestnut street, [N. W.] Second street west of County, and extends from Kempton to Smith street—partially open.

and is situated a little north of the Rural Cemetery.

Griffin street, [S. E.] from Third street east to the Friends Burying Ground.

Grinnell street, [S.] from the river west, across County.

Grove street, [S. W.] between Bedford and Hawthorn, extending from Orchard street westerly.

Hamilton street, [E.] from North Water street east to Rotch's wharf,

State street, [N.] from Maxfeld street north. The numbers are

calculated to commence somewhere south of Kempton st.

Sullivan street, [N. W.] A Court opening from Middle street nearly

opposite No. 228.

Summer street, [N. W.] first street west of County, extending north from Elm street, and passing on the east side of the High School House. The numbers are calculated to commence at Union st.

Sycamore street, [N. W.] west from Pleasant street to Cedar st. Tarkiln Hill, the highest elevation of land in New Bedford, situated from half to one mile west of Acushnet Village.

Tarkiln Hill Road,—road leading from Acushnet over Tarkiln Hill

to Perry's corner.

Third street, [S. E.] from Union street south.

Thomas street, [N.W.] from Hillman street north. The numbers are calculated to commence somewhere south of Hillman st.

Union street, [S.] from the river west across County street.

All that portion of the City lying between a line drawn from the River through the middle of Willis Street to County Street, thence through the middle of County Street to Sycamore Street, and thence through the middle of Sycamore Street to its Western termination, and in the same direction to the Dartmouth line, and a line drawn from the River through the middle of North Street to Hill Street, thence through the middle of Hill Street to Kempton Street, and thence through the middle of Kempton Street or Smith's Mills Road, to the Dartmouth line.

Ward No. 3. 
